Engaging a New Generation

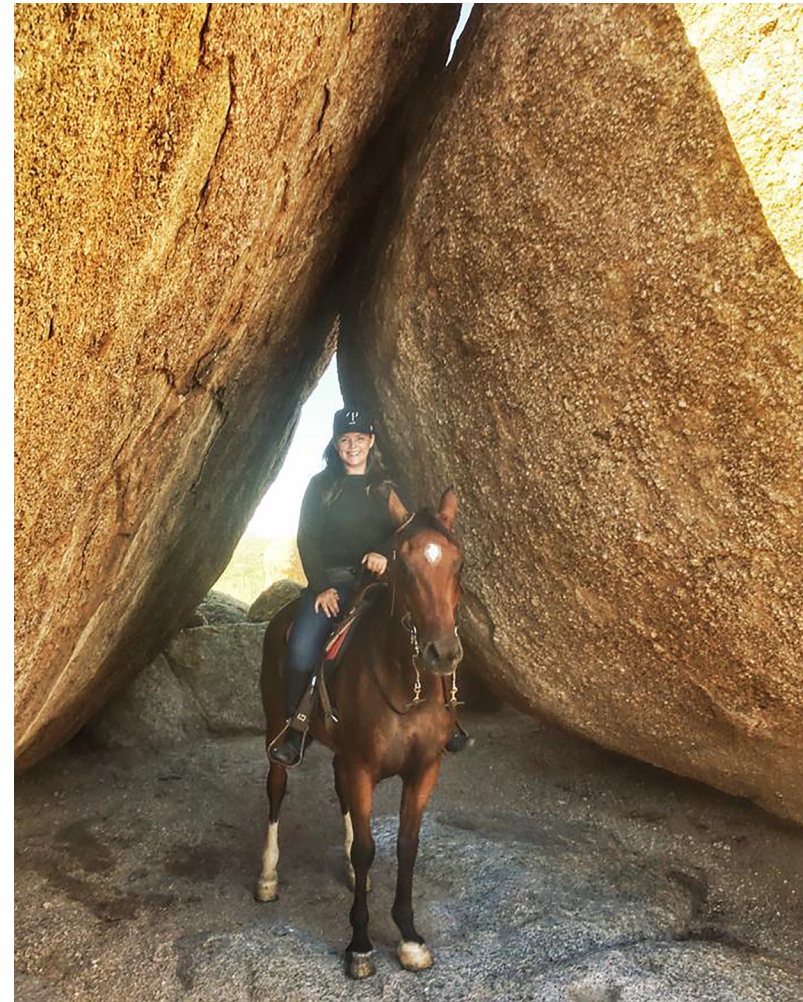
