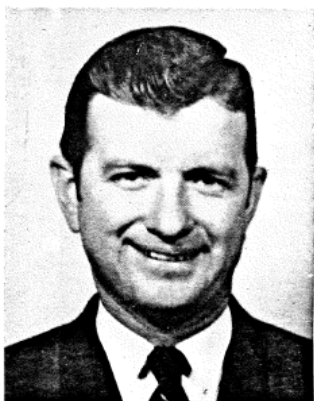




# Stanley G. White

### *Stanley White Sr.*

Stanley White's first professional training position was at Al Marah in 1962. Then he spent the '70s with Lancer Arabians, training horses as well as making trips to Poland, Egypt, Hungary and Czechoslovakia to inspect horses for the Arabian Horse Registry. Later he went back to Egypt to import select horses, including the special Egyptian horse \*Asadd. Stanley said, "If there's one horse in a lifetime that you really love, you're extremely lucky." That horse for him, was \*Asadd, who won national championships in both stallion halter in 1975 and English pleasure in 1979. After Lancer Arabians dispersed their herd, he pursued his lifetime dream and started his own training facility in Citra, Florida, called Stanley G. White's Grandeur Arabians.

Stanley has conducted and been a part of training seminars and clinics throughout his professional career starting in the '60s and he has inspired horse owners, trainers and Arabian enthusiasts throughout his lifetime. He has earned numerous National Championships, and, happily, the winning streak has continued with his amateur clients who have also amassed multiple National Championships and Top Ten awards. He also became a Level 1 judge and judged Class A and Regional shows all over the country. He judged the Canadian Nationals and Youth Nationals, bowing out of judging the U.S. Nationals only due to having several professional trainers in his family as well as obligations to his many clients.

When the Office of the Judges and Stewards Commissioner was begun, Stanley helped develop the curriculum and training materials for the Judges School and was one of the first instructors. For many years Stanley was an active participant and hosted several judges schools at Grandeur. He loved to judge and share his wisdom and knowledge with many young trainers and judges, including his sons Steve and Stanley Junior and grandson Stanley III. His granddaughters, Shanea and Kaitlin, also won national championships as junior riders. Stanley is very proud of their accomplishments. They have carried on a tradition started by their father and grandfather of treating people and horses with kindness, integrity and honesty.

Among his most recent awards, he has been honored with the APAHA Horseman of the Year twice and was nominated several times. In 2011, Stanley and Kitty were awarded the APAHA Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2013, Stanley was one of the first recipients of the Region XII Hall of Fame award.

Everyone who has known Stanley White, Senior, has admired him. He is truly a shining light for the Arabian horse.
