- Judged regional championships in 7 different regions



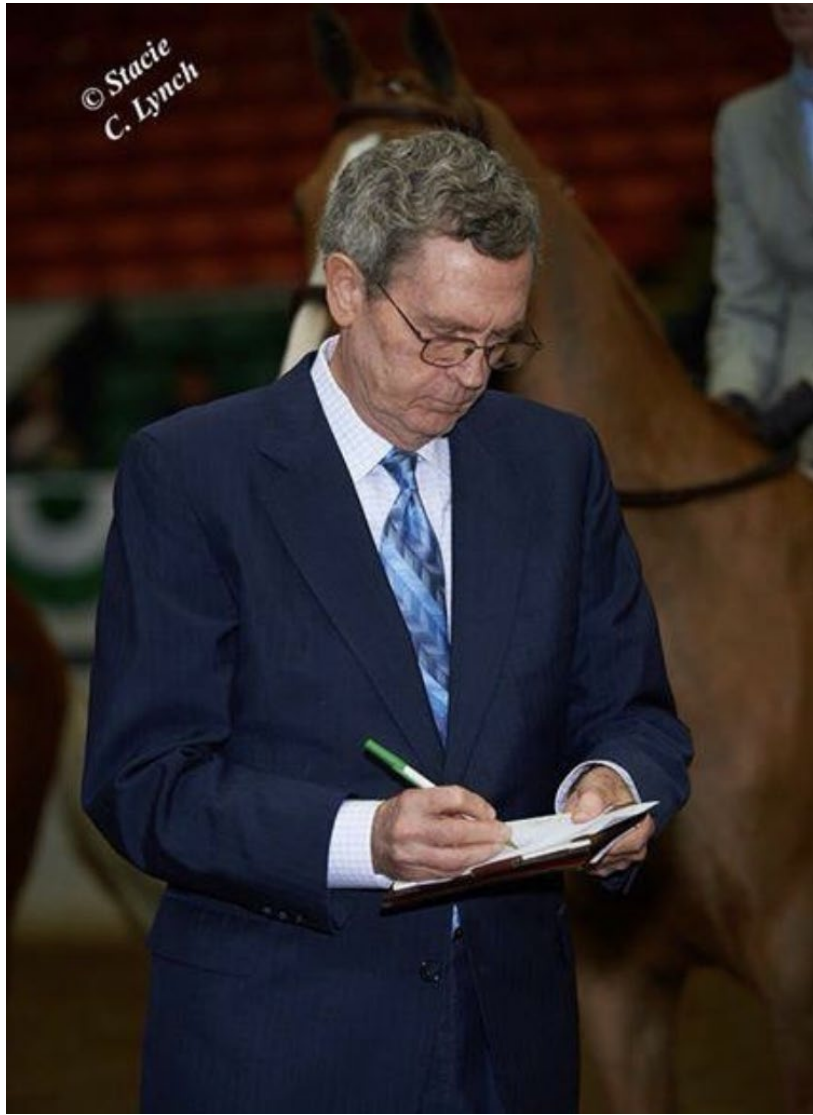
Buck took a somewhat different pathway to become an Arabian judge than most judges. He judged open shows, other breed shows, and all breed shows for many, years prior to acquiring his Arabian card. This experience provided an excellent foundation and great experience for later National and International judging.

Buck shared that a major regret was having to turn down judging the U S Nationals five times due to client conflicts and an opportunity to return to South Africa to judge the South African National Championships. While having to turn down these shows, Buck is grateful for all the other opportunities to judge, travel, learn and meet new people in other countries.

Buck was a member of the first judging panel to use the, then new to Arabians, NRHA Scoring System for reining at the IAHA Snaffle Bit Futurity in 1989. The panel met with a judge from the NRHA in a hotel room before the show for a cram session to learn the system. Buck was also one of the first to use the new scoring system for Arabian Trail at

the Region 1 show. At the Canadian Nationals, he was a member of the judging panel where handheld digital devices were first used to submit class placings to center ring.

He is grateful to The American Morgan Horse Association for the opportunity to judge their Grand National and World Championship Show five times. For the last several years he has enjoyed judging Trail and Ranch classes at local A shows in Texas."
