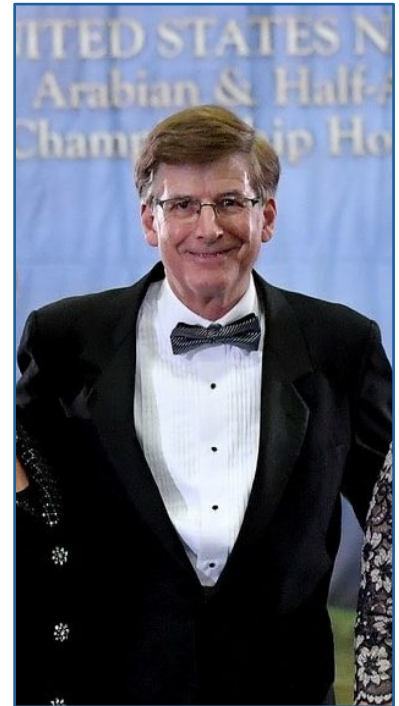




Edwin Sutton

- Licensed Arabian Judge 1982 – 2018
- Judged numerous Youth Nationals, US Nationals
- Judged regional championships in 8 different regions



Edwin grew up on the family farm in Akron, NY where his mother began breeding Arabian horses in 1958. During his school years he showed these horses in the Arabian divisions offered at county fairs. After college, he made the decision to make Arabian horses his career and purchased his first breeding stallion, a straight Egyptian stallion from

Gleannloch Farms in 1971. His dedication to the breed led him to be involved with IAHA as Region 16 Director from 1980-86. He served as a founding member of the Breeders Sweepstake Commission, Chairman of the Nominating committee, Chairman of the Equine Stress committee and Vice Chair of the Canadian National Show.

The path continued to the judges' school and eventually becoming a level one (National/Regional) judge. Judging was a joyful challenge as he enjoyed rewarding beauty and type, hallmarks of the Arabian breed, along with trueness of gait and athletic ability. Over the years he had the privilege of officiating at many class A and regional shows throughout the country.

Highlights were judging in Brazil, Youth Nationals, US Nationals and of course the amazing Scottsdale show. He retired from judging in 2019. Edwin and Corky still reside on the century old family farm where it all started and are still breeding Arabian horses.
