Unlike many people in the horse industry who are raised around horses, Stan Morey got a relatively late start when he began training and grooming horses one summer while a student at Central State University in Edmond, Oklahoma. He was already an accomplished athlete in multiple sports and this athleticism carried over to working with horses. Over the years, he and his wife Susan established Hallmark Farms, winning many awards in the Arabian horse show world and later their family had similar success showing Morgan horses.

Stan credits Stanley White, Sr and Bill Huges for encouraging him to become a judge. His judging career started in 1987, taking him to various regions within US and Canada. He was also fortunate to judge in Brazil. Something Peter Cameron told him many years ago has stuck with him, *“This horse does not owe you anything, you owe the horse everything.”*

When Stan accepted the position of AHA Judges and Stewards Commissioner in 2009 his license had to be put in abeyance by USEF. He was the third commissioner and the first

who brought judging experience to the office, setting new goals and direction. In 2020 he moved from being the Judges and Stewards Commissioner to his current position as Executive Director of AHA.

“To be inducted into the Judges Hall of Fame is very humbling. Having been a part of giving Hall of Fame awards to many other great judges and stewards who have contributed to this breed means a lot to me. I hope that in some small way that the contributions that all of us in this class of inductees have given will help others; I think I can speak for all us in saying that this award honors this breed for what it has done for each of us.”
