
Club Volunteer Service Awards




Nedra Johnson – AHA of San Fernando Valley Vice-President



Lynn Curl – Red Bluff AHA




Nancy Rhode – Montana AHA President


Mary Lou Houge – AHA of Arizona Past President


Karen Higgins Campbell – Legacy AHC of Texas Membership Chair

Susan Lallo – The Arabian Trail & Ranch Horse Association






Jamie Wright – Wisconsin AHA Vice-President






