Resolved.	That the 5-90 document be amended by striking out and inserting as follows:

#### **Establishment of Judges & Stewards Commissioner** (1)

That the position of Judges & Stewards Commissioner be established with the following duties and responsibilities:

- 1) The Commissioner will coordinate and implement the programs of the Education/Evaluation Commission, the Judges and Stewards Selection Committee and Judges & Stewards Steering Committee the following:
  - a. Education/Evaluation Committee
  - b. Judges Selection Committee
  - c. Commissioner's Review Panel
  - d. Judges & Stewards Steering Committee
- 2) The Commissioner will serve as ex-officio member of all Judges and Stewards Committees, and Commissions, working groups, and task forces.

- 3) That the Commissioner's office shall be responsible for the ongoing evaluation of judges and stewards in terms of their actual judging/stewarding performance and compliance with the class specifications and procedures and all other matters involving a judge's or steward's performance.
- 4) The Commission's office has the authority to monitor activities of a judge or steward outside officiating when such activities directly reflect negatively on AHA judges and stewards. The Commissioner will track and has the authority to apply disciplinary actions in said situations.
- 5) 4) The Commissioner may establish a Peer Review Panel(s) to assist in the ongoing evaluation of judges and stewards at any AHA recognized competition. Said Panel Review members must consist of National/Regional level judges or stewards and be approved by the Education and Evaluation Commission (EEC). Further, any compensation or expense for said panel(s) to come from the 5-90 budgets.

#### **CHAPTER XII, COMPETITION OFFICIALS:**

#### Article 1673. AHA Commissioner.

- 1. The AHA Judges and Stewards Commissioner shall be considered a Competition Official (See Art. 112) at all AHA recognized competitions that are also recognized by the USEF.
- Further, the USEF Arabian Rule Proposed Restructure be amended to reflect this same change as Chapter XXVIII, Article 1699J.
- 6) The AHA Judges and Stewards Commissioner shall be considered a Competition Official (See USEF GR113) at all AHA recognized competitions that are also licensed by USEF.
- 7) 5) The Commissioner is to direct the establishment of the programs necessary to perpetuate and implement directives of the Executive Committee, Board of Directors and Convention of AHA with input and assistance from the Judges and Stewards Committees and Commissions.
- 8) 6) The Commissioner is to receive complaints and to act upon those relating to Judges and Stewards conduct when filed by exhibitors, show officials, and other AHA members. There is to be a filing fee, {amount to be set by the AHA Board of Directors}. All official complaints are to be in writing and signed.
- 9) 7) The Commissioner is to acknowledge receipt of all *official* complaints forwarded to the Commissioner's office when the party filing the complaint provides adequate identification for the Commissioner to provide an acknowledgement of receipt.
- 8) The Education/Evaluation Commission (EEC) is to implement a system for approving officials and assigning the officials to the specific Level of Competitions. Prior to such assignment by the EEC, such recommendations, at least 30 days before being finalized are to be provided to the AHA Commissioner for comment and those comments are to be considered by the Commission prior to the EEC taking final action.
  - a. Once a judge has reached National/Regional level status, the ongoing evaluation of the judge shall be completed by the Commissioner. The Commissioner may receive input from the Education and Evaluation Commission based upon their interview process, but only the Commissioner has the authority to maintain the judge's status, remove the National/Regional status or suspend the judge's status. A determination to change the status is subject to a de novo review by the Education and Evaluation Commission, if so requested by the judge, and such review requires a 2/3 vote of the Education and Evaluation Commission to overturn the action of the Commissioner.
- 10) 9) The Commissioner is authorized to employ an Administrative Assistant and/or other full or part-time staff necessary to aid in meeting the responsibilities of the office.
- 11) 10) The Commissioner will be responsible for:
  - a. Investigation of alleged misconduct, at the discretion of the Commissioner, relating to Judges and Stewards. "Misconduct" is defined as:
    - *i.* 1. Misconduct: to include only those activities or other involvement by an AHA Judge or Steward that is in any way related to horses and/or functions relating to horses.
    - ii. Misconduct may include conduct by judges and/or stewards on social media platforms when such activities directly reflect negatively on AHA accredited judges and stewards.
  - b. Reporting results of investigation to Commissioner's Review Panel when in the opinion of the Commissioner such investigation indicates improper conduct by a Judge or Steward of any AHA approved competitions.
  - c. The Commissioner will have the responsibility, when Charges are approved by the Commissioner's Review Panel, of causing Charges to be filed with the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF), Equestrian Canada (EC), or the Arabian Horse Association Ethical Practice Review Board (EPRB), or arbitration if no other appropriate method of resolution is available.
  - d. The Commissioner is responsible for presenting to the USEF *or EC* Hearing Committee, the EPRB or arbitrator the information relating to charges which are filed.

- e. The Commissioner is responsible for withdrawal (dropping) of previously filed *Cc*harges when deemed appropriate by the Commissioner with the Commissioner's Review Panel approval.
- f. The Commissioner is to establish a system to provide for a confidential quarterly Complaint Report to both the President of AHA and the members of the Commissioner's Review Panel.
  - *i.* 1) The Complaints Report will contain:
    - a) file identification number;
    - b) date received;
    - c) the nature of the complaint;
    - d) status of the investigation;
    - e) Commissioner's recommendation (close, investigate, requires more than three (3) months to investigate, etc.) No names or similar identification of the individuals is to be part of this report.
  - *ii.* 2) The Complaint Report and its contents is subject to the confidentiality agreements signed by the individual designated to receive the report, and any party to the complaint investigation, or potential witness, may be excluded from receiving information in their Complaint Report on any issue that may involve them.
- 12) 11) To assist the Commissioner in investigation of allegations relating to conduct of Judges or Stewards, the Commissioner may engage legal or other assistance on a temporary basis to aid in the investigation. Any temporary help used by the Commissioner in the investigation must be within the approved budgetary allocations. The Commissioner may do so within his the approved budget without any other approval being required. In the event such assistance would require expense above the authorized budget, the expenditure would require approval of the Commissioner's Review Panel, Ways & Means Budget & Finance Committee, and either the Executive Director or and the AHA President.
- 13) 12)-The Commissioner shall comply with financial and budgetary procedures and requirements as duties set forth by the AHA Board of Directors and/or the Executive Director. The EEC, Judges & Stewards Selection Committee, the Judges & Stewards Steering Committee and the Commissioner's Review Panel shall be sent budget information and forms in connection with the normal budget cycle communication sent out by the AHA office to all committee chairs., and that copies of the original committee budget be submitted to the Commissioner by the committee be attached for reference by the Ways & Means Committee to the final budget submission of the Commissioner.
- 14) 13) The Commissioner may consult with the Commissioner's Review Panel, the EEC Education & Evaluation Commission, the Judges & Stewards Steering Committee, the Judges & Stewards Selection Committee, the Resolution 5-90 Committee, the AHA Executive Committee and the AHA General Manager Executive Director as he deems appropriate for the purpose of obtaining advice and information relating to matters which are the responsibility of the office of the Commissioner. Such consultation may be formal or informal and is not required to be with the entire membership of any of the above bodies but may involve private consultation with any member of the above. It is not intended to restrict the Commissioner only to the consultation with the these groups, but to indicate these groups are to assist the Commissioner in the fulfillment of the Commission's duties and responsibilities set forth herein.
- **15)** 14) The Commissioner is to interface with USEF/EC in all aspects required to carry out his-the duties as of the Commissioner.
- 16) 15)-The Commissioner is empowered to take action which the Commissioner deems appropriate in any matter in which the Commissioner considers, in his sole opinion, that failure to act in a timely manner will result in immediate and irreparable harm to the public or exhibitor's confidence in the conduct of the Judges or Stewards of any AHA approved competition.
- 17) 16That the Commissioner be empowered to warn, to require more education of, to suspend, place on probation for a specified period of time, or remove a judge or steward from the AHA Approved Judges & Stewards List, as appropriate. Said action subject to a de novo review by the Education and Evaluation Commission, if so requested by the judge or steward, and such review shall require a 2/3 vote of the entire EEC to overturn the actions of the Commissioner. Policies and procedures for the review process, with input from the EEC, to be created and implemented by the effective date.
  - 18) 17) The Commissioner will be required, as a condition of employment, to meet the strictest conflict of interest restrictions placed on Judges. The Commissioner will strive to avoid all involvements which may present a real or potential conflict of interest and will always be mindful that the success of an AHA Commissioner depends largely in public confidence, support, and approval of those associated with the Commissioner's office, both at AHA competitions, as well as while away from such competitions.

19) 18The Commissioner shall at all times strive to avoid any conduct or involvement which might result in impaired public confidence in the honest and orderly conduct of the Commissioner or the integrity of AHA approved competitions.

## (II) Commissioner Records

The Commissioner shall cause to be maintained orderly records relating to the conduct of the duties of the Commissioner's office. These *physical and/or electronic* records/files are the property of AHA and remain subject to confidentiality restrictions placed upon them in perpetuity.

- The information supplied to the Commissioner will in many cases be inconclusive, and not adequately supported with documentation to either prove or disprove the allegations. It is AHA's intent to the extent reasonably possible to protect the good name and reputation of AHA officials (Judges and Stewards) of at Arabian events from damage as a result of unsubstantiated allegations. Therefore, all records of the office of the Commissioner shall be deemed confidential, in accordance with the following:
  - **a.1)** An "Investigation File" is not available outside the Commissioner's office, staff, or counsel for any purpose to any party, including AHA officers, directors, Judges, Stewards or members of AHA or any other party, except as provided below:
    - i.a) The AHA President, in order to better manage the business affairs of AHA, subject to signing of the confidentiality agreement and providing that there is no conflict of interest, may have access to all information in the office of the Commissioner, including investigation files and names;
    - ii.b) The Commissioner with the approval of the AHA President is authorized to share information within the office of the Commissioner with legal counsel representing AHA subject to signing of the confidentiality agreement that restricts use of the information to legal matters relating to AHA and providing that there is no conflict of interest.
    - iii.e) Information from the Investigation File is made available by the Commissioner to the Commissioner's Review Panel; and
    - iv.d)Such information results in the filing of the charges which have been approved for filing by the Commissioner's Review Panel. (When charges have been approved for filing, the information provided to the Commissioner's Review Panel may be made available upon request, following the filing of the charges, to the charged party), or
    - **v.**e) Disclosure is required by law.
  - **b.2)** An investigation should ideally be closed within one year or less of receipt of a **formal** complaint that is reportable in the Complaint Report to the AHA President and Commissioner's Review Panel. a) The period for investigation of a complaint may be extended:
    - *i.* 1) For any period of time that USEF, EC Judicial, or other similar process causes the Commissioner to suspend the investigation due to USEF, EC Judicial or similar processes pending action; or
    - *ii.* 2) By majority vote of the Commissioner's Review Panel at six-month intervals for a maximum total period for an investigation of three years.
    - iii. 3) A closed file from a prior investigation may be combined without restriction with the file for a new complaint at the discretion of the Commissioner.
- 2) 3) All information supplied to the Commissioner is confidential and every reasonable effort shall be utilized to prevent the disclosure of the source until and unless the information results in filing of charges approved by the Commissioner's Review Panel. Information which has been provided by the Commissioner to the Commissioner's Review Panel which results in the Review Panel approval and filing of charges must disclose source.
- 3) 4) A Judge's or Steward's "Permanent File" is for use in carrying out the duties of the office of the Commissioner and not for public use.
  - a) No information shall be placed in a Permanent File which does not identify the sources of the information.
  - b) All Judges and Stewards are entitled with reasonable notice during office hours to review contents of their file. Review of the file contents may be at a location other than the AHA office, if agreed upon by the judge or steward and the Commissioner.
  - c) In the event that a Judge or Steward should wish to do so, they may provide written statements relating to the contents within their file, such information to become a permanent part of their file.
  - **d)** All charges filed and supporting information relating thereto and the finding or other disposition of the charges shall become part of the Permanent File of the Judge or Steward in the Commissioner's office.
- 4) 5) That all Judges and Stewards shall agree to accept and be bound by the confidential provisions assigned to Judges and Stewards files by the Commissioner as a condition of being placed on the approved list of AHA officials. Further, all Judges and Stewards agree that the Commissioner may disclose the material relating to any

investigation or hearing which has resulted in approval by the Commissioner's Review Panel of the filing of charges.

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### (III) Commissioner Appointment and Dismissal Procedures

The Judges and Stewards Commissioner shall be selected and hired for an initial a contract term of 3 three (3) years by affirmative vote of 4 of 6 members of a majority of the AHA Executive Committee with ratification by a majority vote of the Regional Directors Board of Directors. The AHA President in connection with the negotiation of any future contract with a Commissioner, will keep in mind that it is desirable that the physical location of the office be within the primary AHA facility.

- 1) The Commissioner may be dismissed for cause (breach of contract, moral turpitude, dishonesty or theft) by a positive vote of at least four of the six members a majority of the Executive Committee, ratified by a simple majority of the Board of Directors of AHA.
- 2) Termination will not occur without affording the Commissioner an opportunity to make a presentation to the Executive Committee and to the Board of Directors of AHA prior to their voting.
  - a. 1) The Commissioner has a right (solely for the purpose of determining whether or not the termination was truly "for cause") to arbitration at the option of the Commissioner. The Commissioner must request the arbitration within 15 (fifteen) days following receipt by the Commissioner of notification of the AHA Board of Directors approval of a "for cause" discharge.
  - **b.** 2) The arbitration would be in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association and the arbitrator would be charged with determination as to whether the discharge was in fact "for cause".
- 3) The President, with the support of 3 three (3) or more members of the Executive Committee will have the right, in matters of cause, to immediately suspend (for a period not to exceed 15 days) the Commissioner until a meeting of the Executive Committee can be convened to afford the opportunity for the Commissioner to make a presentation to the Executive Committee on the matter which caused the suspension.
  - Regional Directors are members of the AHA Board of Directors who are not officers (Executive Committee) of AHA.
- 4) In the event that 4 a majority of mMembers of the Executive Committee, following the presentation by the Commissioner, feel that termination of employment is appropriate, they will refer the matter within 45 days to the Board of Directors who will decide on the matter of continued employment of the Commissioner following the Commissioner's presentation, including whether or not termination of employment is appropriate. Termination of the Commissioner will require approval of 2/3 of the Board of Directors.
- 5) The Commissioner *may continue in their duties and* is to remain on paid status during any period during which continuation of employment is being considered by either the Executive Committee or Board of Directors.
- 6) The President, with the Executive Committee approval, will exercise the authority to appoint an acting Commissioner in the event the position becomes vacant for any reason, including resignation, disability, or discharge for cause. In the event the position of Commissioner is vacant, the Executive Committee will hire a new Commissioner as soon as possible.
- 7) In the event that 4-a majority of members of the Executive Committee are unable to agree upon a Commissioner for a period of six months from the date the position becomes vacant, the President will nominate an individual of his their choice subject to approval by a majority of the Regional Board of Directors.

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## (IV) Commissioner's Characteristics

The Executive Committee initiate immediate action to employ a Commissioner following convention approval with due consideration of characteristics suggested by the Study Committee.

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## (IV) (V) Compensation/Employment Location of the Commissioner

The compensation and location of the Commissioner will be set by the Executive Committee, subject to approval by the Regional Board of Directors.

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## (V) (VI) Commissioner's Review Panel

The Commissioner's Review Panel shall be established for the purpose of reviewing the investigations report containing information developed by the Commissioner's office which relates to the allegations of improper conduct on the part of official(s) (Judges or Stewards). This investigation report is to be in the Commissioner Review Panel's hands at least five (5) days prior to being asked to act.

The Review Panel is to be provided with an investigation report and copies of any supporting documentation for only those allegations for which the Commissioner feels there exists adequate evidence to support the

- allegations of alleged misconduct. All names to be withheld by the Commissioner until the Review Panel's decision is made. The charged party to be given the opportunity to respond prior to the Review Panel's review.
  - 2) The Review Panel is to act only upon the written information provided to it. The Review Panel members will be provided with the investigation report and a *hard copy or electronic* ballot wherein they can indicate their vote based upon the written investigation report and the supporting documentation.
  - 3) The filing of charges will require a positive vote of at least *five* (5) of the *nine* (9) members of the Review Panel. The Review Panel is to have *five* (5) days in which to consider the information supplied and to make a determination.
  - The Review Panel will, at the request of one or more of the members thereof, convene a telephone conference call in which all Review Panel members will be invited to participate with the Commissioner for the purpose of enhancing their understanding of the investigation report.
  - 5) The Commissioner's Review Panel shall consist of *nine* (9) members:
    - a. one currently licensed Arabian judge
    - b. one currently licensed USEF Category 2 steward or EC steward.
    - c. two recognized breeders (See definition in CBP 111.13)
    - d. one recognized trainer

- e. one show manager or show secretary (See definition in CBP 111.13)
- f. two exhibitors who are current holders of Amateur Cards (See definition in CBP 111.13)
- g. one member at large
- 6) This proposed slate may be supplemented by nominations from the floor. The members are elected by Convention delegates for two-year rotating terms with a limit of six (6) consecutive years of service. Terms are to be staggered. During the 1991 term, the panel will define the terms breeder, trainer, show manager, and amateur exhibitor. Said definitions shall be distributed at the 1991 annual convention.
- 7) Only prospective candidates for the Panel who fall within the definitions shall be permitted to run for election.

  For the purpose of transition, the Committee recommends that the convention approve the following 5 individuals to serve on the Committee from this convention through December 31, 1991:
  - -Jane Schroeder (Reg. 7) Breeder
- Art Townley (Reg. 9) Steward
- Sheila Varian (Reg. 2) Breeder
- Hope McGeary (Reg. 15) At Large
  - Richard Dady (Reg. 15) Judge
- Non-voting attorney advisor to be selected by the committee.

The additional four members (one recognized trainer, one show manager, two exhibitors who are current holders of amateur cards) shall be nominated by the Judges and Stewards Ad Hoc committee for approval by the Board of Directors at their January 1991 meeting.

- 8) Any vacancy of more than two (2) months that occurs between Convention elections will be filled on an interim basis, upon recommendation of the Commissioner, by the President with approval of a majority of the Board of Directors.
- 9) The Commissioner can recommend removal by the Executive Committee of a Review Committee member for cause, after a review of the facts by the <u>non-conflicted members of the</u> Review Committee.
- 10) Review Panel members will be ineligible to hold any other office or any other Judges & Stewards committee or national show commissions appointments within AHA. Vacancy shall be filled between conventions on an interim basis by the President with approval of a majority of the Board of Directors.
- **11) The** Commissioner's Review Panel shall, upon request by the Commissioner, consult on matters relating to conflict of interest issues relating to approval of officials and such other matters as the Commissioner shall request.
- **12)** AHA shall indemnify the Commissioner and members of the Review Panel for defense costs or any damages resulting from good faith conduct of the duties assigned herein.
- 13) When facts are in evidence and not disputed by the parties, the Commissioner may issue "Finding(s)" following the Review Panel's approval and implement appropriate action for the situation.

## (VI) (VII). Education/Evaluation Commission

That the Judges Seminar Commission be renamed The Education/Evaluation Commission, with the following duties: The Education/Evaluation Commission (*EEC*) has the following duties:

1) To develop education programs for existing Judges and Stewards and for prospective Judges and Stewards. and to increase the level of activity in the education of Stewards.

- To assist in the development of a correspondence program curriculum for use in education of members, scoring officials, Judges and Stewards.
  - 3) To provide access for AHA Membership to attend at the Judges and Stewards training sessions Exhibitors/Judges School-for a nominal reasonable fee.
  - 4) To recommend to the Commissioner review and make recommendations for the qualifications and requirements for the establishment of AHA approved Stewards and <u>Competition</u> <u>Compliance</u> <u>Officials</u> <u>as defined in the Value</u> <u>Show rules. list.</u>
  - 5) To make specific proposals to the Commissioner for increasing the authority and responsibilities of Stewards **and**<u>Competition</u> <u>Compliance</u> <u>Officials</u> <u>as defined in the Value Show rules</u> in the enforcement of rules during the conduct of the competition.
  - 6) To take the responsibility for final action on the application of an AHA member to be approved as an AHA approved Judge or Steward providing that:
    - a. The Education/Evaluation Commission certifies that the candidate has passed all objective tests of knowledge established by the Education/Evaluation Commission; and is licensed as an Arabian judge by USEF or EC, and
    - b. The Education/Evaluation Commission must provide the Commissioner with a preliminary list of Judges being considered for approval at least 30 days prior to the candidate being considered for final approval; and
    - c. The Education/Evaluation Commission must consider, prior to final approval of a candidate, any concerns that the Commissioner provides to them during the 30 day comment period.
  - 7) To take final action following consideration of comments from the Commissioner relating to the Level of Competition, including specialty areas of expertise, to which a Judge should be assigned. It is anticipated that each Judge and Steward would complete an application to be reviewed by the Commission which would provide the Commission with information relating to:
    - a. A record of shows, including number of horses, in which the official has been a Judge. or Steward.
    - b. Information relating to the activities within the horse industry for those applying.
    - c. Any prior USEF/EC hearings, Board or AHA Ethical Practice Review Board proceeding in which the official was charged, with the result of such hearing.
    - d. Educational background relating to judging or stewarding which demonstrates knowledge for the role for which the official is seeking approval.
    - e. Completion of psychological or similar test (test to be recommended by the EEC following consideration of comments from the Commissioner) with results appropriate if applying for National or Regional approval.

      e. f) Such other information as the Commission may deem necessary to complete task assigned to the Commission.
  - 8) To have access, on a confidential basis, to all education and evaluation files for an applicant developed by the Commissioner's office, as well as Judges & Stewards permanent file, excluding any investigation files, to assist them in evaluation of an official's ability conduct, and experience as an official. All such files to be established and maintained by the Commissioner's office for use by the Commission.
  - **9)** The Commission is to assign Judges <del>and Stewards</del> to Levels of Competition in accordance with the following:
    - a. AHA Accredited National/Regional Judge National and Regional Shows
    - b. AHA Accredited Judge All other shows.

- c. The levels of competition are established for the purpose of providing a blueprint for advancement in the complexity of the judging or stewarding assignment in order to provide experience for AHA Judges and Stewards prior to advancing to the more complex level of judging. It is recommended that a Judge officiate at 5 or more competitions prior to progressing. An official may accept assignments below the level of competition approved for that official. Acceptance of assignment at a higher level requires the Judge to obtain written approval of the Commissioner prior to accepting such assignment.
- 10) To be responsible for developing a training program, approved by the Commissioner, to produce quality Judges and Stewards for AHA approved competitions. Curriculum will be developed, including but not limited to the following:
  - a. Judges and Stewards schooling for prospective judges and stewards.
  - b. Testing program for Stewards intended to confirm their knowledge of Arabian rules which once demonstrated, would allow a USEF approved Steward to be placed on the AHA approved list with the Commissioner's approval. It is anticipated that initially this will be correspondence "open book test".
  - c. Ongoing evaluation of applicants, "r" and "R" Judges' and Stewards' performance to include a regular evaluation of the Judges and Stewards and their performance at the level of competition assigned. Such evaluation to result in the official being:
    - i. Raised to a higher level of competition;

371 ii. Continue at the same level of competition; 372

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- iii. Removed to a lower level of competition when available;
- iv. Removed from AHA approved list
- d. Ongoing review of National/Regional level judge's performance to include regular evaluation of the Judges and their performance. Such evaluation is to be forwarded to the Commissioner for his/her review and action.
  - i. d) The EEC will coordinate with the Commissioner.
- e) The members of the EEC are to have access on a confidential basis to all information in a Judge or Steward's permanent file to assist them in evaluation of the official's ability, conduct, and experience as an official.
- 11) The Education/Evaluation Commission (EEC) is to implement a system for approving officials and assigning the officials to the specific Level of Competitions. Prior to such assignment by the EEC, such recommendations, at least 30 days before being finalized are to be provided to the AHA Commissioner for comment and those comments are to be considered by the Commission prior to the EEC taking final action.
  - Once a judge has reached National/Regional level status, the ongoing evaluation of the judge shall be completed by the Commissioner.
  - b. The Commissioner and the EEC will establish content of the evaluation of all levels of judges, including National/Regional level status.
  - c. The Commissioner may receive input from the Education and Evaluation Commission based upon their interview and/or testing process, but only the Commissioner has the authority to maintain the judge's status, remove the National/Regional status or suspend the judge's status.
  - d. A determination to change the status is subject to a de novo review by the Education and Evaluation Commission, if so requested by the judge, and such review requires a 2/3 vote of the Education and Evaluation Commission to overturn the action of the Commissioner.
- 12)-f) The Commission will consist of nine (9) members, elected by the Board of Directors. for a 3--year rotating term. The Commission is to consist of any member of AHA who ideally would have relevant experience in the area of educational program development and/or delivery.
  - a. No member may serve more than three four (4) consecutive three-year terms. Time served due to appointment or election to fill a vacancy does not count towards the consecutive terms.
  - b. Establish structure so no more than one EEC member goes off at a time due to reaching the maximum consecutive terms. This may entail having a one or two-year term to make this adjustment.
  - c. Terms commence on January 1st of the year following the election by the Board of Directors.
  - Any vacancy of more than two (2) months that occurs between elections will be filled on an interim basis, upon recommendation of the Commissioner, by the President with approval of a majority of the Board of
  - e. The Commissioner can recommend removal by the Executive Committee of an EEC member from the Commission for cause, after a review of the facts by the Review Committee.
  - f. g) Members of this Commission will be ineligible to serve on any other Judges or Stewards committee or commission, or as a national officer of AHA, although the Chair of the EEC may serve as a non-voting liaison to these committees, panels, or commissions. Current members to continue until existing terms expire.
  - 10) Maintain technical competence of the Judges and Stewards.

#### **Judges & Stewards Steering Committee** (VII) <del>(VIII)</del>

That the The Judges & Stewards Steering Committee functions with the following duties:

- 1) The Committee will encourage licensed judges and stewards to convey reasonable concerns relative to the Judges and Stewards areas of responsibility to the Steering Committee and then from the Committee to the Commissioner.
- 2) The Commissioner may bring judges and stewards concerns to the Steering Committee for their consideration and
- 3) This Committee will seek to ensure that all approved Judges and Stewards are knowledgeable of, and adhere to, the Judges Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics Officials Code of Conduct.
- 4) The Committee will assist in communication between the Commissioner and the Judges and Stewards in an effort to improve understanding and cooperation.
  - The Committee will be responsible for providing non-binding advice and counsel on matters relating to conflict of interest and ethics, without any immunity for the inquiring Judge and/or Steward wishing to discuss such matters of <del>concern</del>.
- 5) Conflict of Interest:

- a. If an official has questions concerning USEF/EC conflict of interest rules, the judge or steward is to be directed to contact USEF or EC for an official answer.
- b. If an official has questions about a possible conflict of interest at a Value Show, or other AHA competition that is not recognized by USEF or EC, the Commissioner may ask for input from the Steering Committee.
- c. Such advice and counsel, therefore, cannot be utilized for defense of any acts or conduct finally undertaken by the Judge and/or Steward.
- d. This does not prevent either the Committee or the Judge and/or Steward seeking advice from discussing the matters with the Commissioner should they wish to do so, with the knowledge that advice and counsel from the Commissioner is non-binding and provides no immunity for the inquiring party from investigation and/or other actions that may be taken by the Commissioner and/or others.
- e. Such advice and counsel, therefore, cannot be utilized for defense of any acts or conduct finally undertaken by the Judge and/or Steward.
- 6 3) The *nine* (9) members of this Committee will be elected *by their peers to serve three-year staggered terms* by the AHA approved Judges and Stewards according to the following procedures:
  - a. **Seven (7) currently licensed USEF or EC Arabian** Judges. **To be** elected by AHA **A**pproved Judges according to current procedures established for the Judges & Stewards Steering Committee.
  - b. Two (2) currently licensed Category 2 USEF Stewards or EC Stewards. To be elected by AHA approved Stewards from those Stewards which officiated at least two (2) AHA events in the prior year, using procedures similar to those used by to elect-Judges. Members of this Committee will be ineligible to serve on any other Judges or Stewards committees or commissions.
  - c. A Chair of the Education and Evaluation Commission will serve as a non-voting member/liaison of the Steering Committee.
  - d. Elected 7 Judges and 2 Stewards to serve 3-year staggered terms.
  - e. Terms commence on January 1st of the year following the election.
  - f. An individual can serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms 3-year terms.
  - g. Any vacancy of more than two (2) months that occurs between Conventions will be filled on an interim basis, upon recommendation of the Commissioner, by the President with approval of a majority of the Board of Directors.
  - h. The Commissioner can recommend removal by the Executive Committee of a Steering Committee member for cause, after a review of the facts by the Review Committee.
- 7-4) The AHA First Vice President (or other A member of the Executive Committee designated by the AHA President will be designated as the liaison for the matters of concern to the members of this Committee.
- 8 5) This Committee will be given adequate notice and be allowed and encouraged to provide up to one page material/notices to be included in the Commissioner's newsletter and/or AHA electronic communications for communication with distributed to Judges and Stewards.

## (VIII) (-IX) Judges & Stewards Selection Committee

The purpose of the Judges and Stewards Selection Committee to be as follows:

- 1) This Committee is to select the Judges and Stewards required for the National Shows from the approved National/Regional Judges lists provided by the Commissioner, who compiles the list from various sources and personal knowledge, & Stewards, up to (twelve) 12 eighteen (18) months in advance.
  - a. In the event that less than the required number of Judges are available from the AHA Accredited National/Regional Judge list, then the Selection Committee may select from the AHA Accredited Judges List of Registered (R) judges only after exhausting the list of all AHA Accredited National/Regional Judges, in that order.
  - b. Exception: Specialty judges can be hired up to twenty-four (24) months in advance of the national competition.
- 2) At least *thirty* (30) days prior to finalizing their selections and assignments the Selection Committee provide a confidential list of the individuals proposed by the Committee and their proposed assignments to the AHA Commissioner for comment or other input to the Judges & Stewards Selection Committee.
- 3) The Selection Committee, *with input from the Commissioner*, will have the final responsibility for the selection and assignment of Judges and Stewards for National events.
- 4) The Selection Committee is to make selection of a Judge or Steward for any other AHA sponsored functions as directed by the Commissioner, Executive Committee, Board of Directors or convention actions.

- 5) The Judges and Stewards will be selected from the then current AHA approved list maintained by the Commissioner, unless specific exception is recommended by the Selection Committee and approved by the EEC following consultation with the Commissioner.
- 5) National Show Commissions will be asked to provide input into steward and technical delegate selection.
- 6) Members of this Committee may not exhibit at any function for which they select or hire a Judge or Steward.
- 7) The Committee will consist of *six* (6) members elected by the Convention delegates for a-three 3-year rotating terms. Members of this Committee may not serve more than *six* (6) consecutive years, except that a member that has served less than six (6) years may run and if elected, serve their full term. Terms commence on January 1<sup>st</sup> following election.

## **Procedures:**

- a. It is understood and agreed, that there will be an election held in 2023 and the new procedure of electing members to the committee for a three-year term rather than a two-year term.
- b. In 2023 an election will be held during the Annual Convention with at least three names placed in nomination. The two candidates receiving the highest vote totals will be elected to serve a three year term and the candidate receiving the third highest vote totals will be elected to serve a two-year term.
- c. In 2024 an election will be held during the Annual Convention with at least three names placed in nomination. The two candidates receiving the highest vote totals will be elected to serve a three-year term and the candidate with the third highest vote totals will be elected to serve a one-year term.
- d. Beginning in 2025 (and thereafter) an election will be held during the Annual Convention with at least two names placed in nomination and the two candidates receiving the highest votes will be elected for a three-year term.
- 8) Members of this Committee will be ineligible to serve any Judges and Stewards Committee or Commissions or to serve on the National Show Commissions. Current members to continue until existing terms expire.
- 9) The Judges and Stewards Selection Committee will coordinate with the Commissioner.
- 10) The USEF Arabian Division Rules Committee be authorized to submit the following proposed rule change as an extraordinary matter to the USEF, requesting it to be effective March 1, 1991:

"The AHA Commissioner's title and mailing address shall be contained in all Competition publications."

(X) Judges Rating Committee

That the Judges Rating Committee be dissolved.

**(XI)** Judges Review Committee

That Judges Review Committee be dissolved as a standing AHA Committee effective with the hiring of a Commissioner.

(XII) That resolution 30-76 be amended with the following underlined section:

" ... beginning in 1977 all AHA approved shows employing more than one judge must indicate in their premium list which type of classes each judge will adjudicate.

- (XIII) The AHA Staff will integrate the resolutions passed #8-00 through #24-00 including any amendments thereto, into the existing Resolution #5-90 as currently amended, and to make such other modifications to AHA procedures and policy so as to implement the intent of these resolutions
  - The Legal Oversight Committee will prepare the appropriate Confidentiality Agreement as required by these resolutions subject to approval thereof by the AHA Board of Directors.
  - 2) The effective date for these resolutions will be January 1, 2001, unless otherwise specified.
  - 8) Any vacancy of more than two (2) months that occurs between Conventions will be filled on an interim basis, upon recommendation of the Commissioner, by the President with approval of a majority of the Board of Directors.
  - 9) The Commissioner can recommend removal by the Executive Committee of a Selection Committee member for cause, after a review of the facts by the Review Committee.
  - **10)** 8) Members of this Committee will be ineligible to serve on any Judges and Stewards committee or commission, or to serve on the National Show Commissions.
  - 11) 9) The Judges and Stewards Selection Committee will coordinate with the Commissioner, and, Be It Further

## **AR176 General**

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Protective headgear (as defined in AR111) is encouraged but is not required for all classes within this section.

1. In-hand, under saddle and sport horse show hack classes for (1) Arabians, and (2) Half Arabians/Anglo Arabian sport horses may be held separately or in conjunction with any licensed Arabian competition. Sport horse in-hand, under

- saddle and sport horse show hack classes may be held for stallions, mares and geldings. SUBCHAPTER AR-1 applies to sport horse classes.

  2. Sport horse in-hand and under saddle classes may be divided at the discretion of competition management into
  - 2. Sport horse in-hand and under saddle classes may be divided at the discretion of competition management into dressage type and hunter type. Horses may cross enter. All appointments and attire must match for the discipline being shown. Competition management is encouraged to offer separate championship classes for each type, but the championship classes may be combined at the discretion of competition management. If competition management decides to combine the types for the championship, the appointments and attire for each exhibitor must match for the specified discipline (dressage or hunter). Please refer to DR120 121 and HU 105 107 rules.
    - (a) Dressage type displays the conformation and movement qualities as follows: Horses of this type carry a higher set-on neck than the hunter type, with sufficient length and flexion of the poll. Movement should be free, elastic, active and regular with good push from behind, without tension, and with an uphill balance.
    - (b) Hunter type displays the conformation and movement qualities as follows: Horses of this type carry a more level balance than the dressage type, with easy, fluid, ground covering movement. The hunter type horse tends to move with a longer frame, with good push from behind, free of tension and showing good balance.
  - 3. Sport Horse In-Hand Championships shall be based upon highest scoring horses in qualifying classes. Sport Horse In-Hand Champions and Reserve Champions must be at least one year of age. No horse may be named Champion and Reserve Champion in the same class. (Example: when amateur and open classes qualify for the same championship class.) If the same horse has the two (2) highest scores, the next highest eligible horse shall be named Reserve Champion.


## **AR177 Sport Horse In-Hand Classes**

Conformation is to be evaluated in terms of potential trainability, potential performance and predisposition to soundness. Form to Function is to be emphasized. Blemishes are not to count unless resulting from conformation faults. Gaits are to be evaluated in terms of purity, quality and correctness. Correct gaits which contribute to ease in training and the horse remaining sound and usable are most important. Purity and quality are judged mainly in profile. Correctness is judged mainly while the horse is coming to moving away from and going from coming to the judge's position at the apex of the triangle. Colts and stallions two years and over must have both testicles descended. Horses with loss of sight in one eye may compete in sport horse in-hand classes.


- 1. Horses will be shown individually on the triangle; assistant handlers or whip handlers are not allowed. In-hand classes may be held in any age groups deemed appropriate by competition management and published in the prize list, with the exception that horses of one sex shall not be judged against those of the opposite sex. Exception: specified group classes or specified championship classes may have horses of all sexes.
- 2. Open cards may be used. Following a posted or announced order, or on request from the judge, entries in each class will approach the judging area one at a time, walk to the apex of the triangle. Open cards may be used. Conformation judging may take place before or after the performance on the triangle, so wait for the judge's instructions. Wait for the judge's request to proceed on the triangle. When the judge signals, the handler exhibitor will lead the horse on the perimeter of the triangle in a clockwise direction, at the walk (small triangle) and trot (large triangle), returning to the apex and wait for further instructions. Repetition of all or any part of the movement on the triangle may only be allowed performed at the judge's request only request of the judge. At the completion of the judging, the handler will lead the horse away from the judging area. The triangle may be adjusted to fit local conditions.
- 3. Triangle: *The triangle may be adjusted to fit local conditions.* Corners should be well defined. A marker will be used at the apex and at each corner to define placement of turn for the exhibitor. Use of plants or flowers is allowed.

4. The horse is to be shown in an "open position", for conformation judging. The traditional way of showing open position would be with the right one front leg slightly back forward and the right one hind leg slightly forward; but as long as all four legs of the horse are visible to the judge when standing on either side of the horse, this would be

- 119 acceptable. The objective is to have all four legs of the horse visible to the judge when standing on either side of the horse. The horse's head and neck-horse should be allowed to show in carry a natural and comfortable carriage, and with the handler should stand standing slightly away from the horse, with a loose lead line. It is permissible for the handler to use a discreet method to keep the horse's attention, such as a candy wrapper.
  - 5. Sport Horse Groups in-Hand. The AHA Group Score Sheet shall be used. The judge will be assigned a scribe who will record scores and comments as dictated by the judge. *Competition management will record class results on the Master Score sheet.* Groups will be examined one group at a time, but not necessarily on the triangle. The judge will require the individuals of each group to move at the walk and trot. Horses shall stand for conformation judging before and/or after completion of the group's movement.
  - 6. Foals may not be shown loose. Foals shall not accompany nor be accompanied by their dam.
  - 7. When possible, the announcement of awards will include the breeding of the horses placed: sire and dam as well as the name of the owner and the breeder.
  - 8. **The j**udge must excuse from the ring, any unruly horse, or one whose actions threaten to endanger other exhibitors, or their entries officials or show staff.
  - 9. A whip may be used to guide the horse. The whip may be a maximum of 6', no attachments.
  - 10. Causes for mandatory elimination from the arena or designated judging area for In-Hand classes are:
    - (a) Removal of eyelashes.

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- (b) Changing the color of the main and/or tail (AR106.10.c); or
- (c) Applying a product to a horse's hoof to hide or conceal a conformation defect. Only clear or transparent products may be used on the hooves of horses when shown in Breeding and/or the In-Hand classes.
- 11. An entry must be penalized for:
  - (a) Excessive amounts of oil, grease or other similar substances.
  - (b) Balding of the area around the eyes or proximal to the muzzle and nostrils.: or
  - (c) Excessive use of the whip or actions that may disturb other entries shall be severely penalized.

## **AR 178 Sport Horse In Hand Scoring Procedures**

- 1. The AHA Individual Sport Horse score sheet shall be used. Each judge will be assigned a scribe who will record scores and comments as dictated by the judge. Horses will be shown individually on the triangle. Sport horse In-Hand classes are exempt from using the Arabian Halter Judging System.
- 2. The judge shall use the AHA approved individual score sheets for individual classes, and the individual Group Score Sheet for group classes (Get of Sire/Produce of Dam). AHA will provide the AHA individual, group, master class, and championship Score Sheets to Competition Management via the website. Competition management may make as many individual copies as necessary for their competition. The AHA Group Score sheet will be used for Sport Horse Groups in-hand (Get of Sire/Produce of Dam).
- 3. AHA will provide the score sheets including the master score sheets and championship score sheets to competition management via the AHA website. Competition Management may make as many individual copies as necessary for their competition.
- 3.4.INDIVIDUAL CLASSES The AHA score sheet is divided as follows:

#### The AHA score sheet is divided as follows:

- (a) Movement 40% (20% for walk and 20% for trot)
- (b) Conformation 40% (transmissible weakness or predisposition to unsoundness shall be penalized commensurate with severity)
- (c) Expression, Manners, Willingness 10%
- (d) Quality, Balance and Harmony; Suitability as a sport horse 10%
- (e) Transmissible weaknesses or predisposition to unsoundness shall be penalized commensurate with severity.

- 6. A scribe shall be provided for each judge whose main duty is to record the judge's scores and comments on the score sheets. The scribe may be asked to transfer scores from the individual sheets to the master score sheet.
- 7. Tied scores for Sport Horse In-Hand shall be broken first by referring to movement, then conformation, then overall balance, and finally manners. If the horses are still tied, the judge (or call judge in a multiple judge system), will make a final tie-breaking decision.
- 8. When multiple judges officiate the same class, competition management may assign separate or shared triangles. In either case, judges will have separate score sheets and scribes.
- 9. Scores shall be reported as a total based on the stated percentages against a possible total of 100% and all scores and placings must be posted. Unofficial scores may be posted during the class and/or final score may be posted at the end of each class.
- 10. Sport Horse in hand championships shall be based upon the highest scoring horses in qualifying classes. Sport horse in-hand champions and reserve champions must be at least one year of age. No horse may be named champion and reserve champion in the same class. (Example: when amateur and open classes qualify for the same championship class.). If the same horse has the two (2) highest scores, the next highest eligible horse shall be named reserve champion.
- 11. If a mathematical error on the score sheet is discovered, it must be brought to the attention of competition management within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the competition day. Competition management must announce said posting and must make score sheets available to competitors immediately as soon as possible (ensuring all scores are first recorded on the master score sheets for each class).

### **AR179 Sport Horse in-Hand Appointments**

1. Tack

Bridles are mandatory on horses three years and older. A bridle shall be a dressage-type snaffle bridle (for dressage type – *see DR rules*) or hunter-type snaffle bridle (for hunter type – *see HU rules*). Snaffle bit may be with or without cheeks, keepers allowed. If the dressage type/hunter type splits are not offered, the exhibitor may choose the type of snaffle bridle used. A split or single lead made of either leather or leather-like materials, with or without chain, may be used and must be attached to both sides of the bit, with/or instead of reins. If using a single lead, a coupler may be used to attach to both sides of the bit. Horses aged two years old may be shown in a bridle (as listed above) as described above, or a plain leather stable or leather-like halter. Horses under the age of two years-must be shown in a plain leather stable or leather-like halter. A single lead, with or without a chain, made of either leather or leather like material, must be used with a halter. Whether used with a bridle or a halter, a properly fitted chain should be short enough to prevent the horse from getting it in their mouth and must never be placed over the nose or through the mouth. In all cases, if a chain is used, it must be properly fitted to prevent the horse from getting it in his/her mouth. The chain must never be placed over the horse's nose or through the mouth of the horse. Competitors with non-conforming appointments will be eliminated from judging consideration.

2. Attire

a. Conservative casual attire is recommended for the handler. This would include casual pants and shirt. Also acceptable would be Dressage or Hunter attire including breeches, boots, shirt with tie, stock tie or choker collar, providing the tack match the attire for the specified discipline. If the handler chooses to wear

- breeches, type of shirt and footwear is up to the handler (i.e. polo shirt, show shirt, running shoes, boots).

  Jackets, hats, vests and gloves are optional.
  - b. The handler may only carry one whip, maximum length of six feet, including lash and without attachments (i.e. plastic bag, ribbons, etc.)
  - c. Protective headgear (as defined in AR111) is encouraged but not required.

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AR180 Sport Horse Under Saddle

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- 1. Subchapters AR1 and AR4 apply to Sport Horse Under Saddle *classes*.
- 2. Score sheets are not used for Sport Horse Under Saddle. Scribes are not used for Sport Horse Under Saddle.
- 3. Judge(s) must excuse from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger other exhibitors or their entries or show officials/staff.
- 4. To enter the ring counterclockwise at the trot. To be shown **both ways of the ring** at walk, trot, and canter both directions of the ring. Judge may request a lengthening of stride at any gait and may request horses to **rein**-back in the lineup.
  - a. Open to be judged on performance (purity and quality of gaits), manners, conformation, suitability as a Sport Horse, and quality.
  - b. Amateur to be judged on manners, performance (purity and quality of gaits), suitability as a Sport Horse, conformation and quality.
  - c. Junior Horse to be judged on quality, suitability as a Sport Horse, performance (purity and quality of gaits), conformation and manners.
  - d. Sport Horse Under Saddle Walk/Trot 10 & Under as well as Sport Horse Walk Trot Under Saddle 11 & Over may be held.
- 5. SPORT HORSE UNDER SADDLE/SPORT HORSE SHOW HACK: Fall of horse and/or rider = Elimination.
- 6. Horses with an unnatural tail carriage shall be placed at the bottom of the class.

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#### AR181 Sport Horse Under Saddle Appointments (Tack and Attire)

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- 1. Competitors with non-conforming appointments are ineligible to receive an award in that respective class.
- 2. Protective headgear (as defined in AR111) is encouraged but not required.
- 3. Appointments (tack & attire) must adhere to one discipline (dressage or hunter) and are not to be mixed. Refer to DR<del>120-121</del>, and HU<del>105-107-rules on appointments</del>. Mixing tack is not permitted (e.g. Pelham bit not permitted with a dressage style bridle.) Protective headgear (as defined in AR111) is encouraged but not required.
  - a. Converters on Pelham bits are not permitted and two reins are required. Double bridles are permitted. If using a double bridle of either type (dressage or hunter), the lever arm/shank (length below the mouthpiece) must not exceed 3.94 inches (10 cm.). The inside diameter of the bridoon ring must not exceed 3.15 inches (8 cm.)
  - b. Unconventional bits may be penalized at the discretion of the judge.
  - c. Double bridles are permitted. If using a double bridle of either type (dressage or hunter), the lever arm/shank (length below the mouthpiece) must not exceed 3.94 inches (10 cm.). The inside diameter of the bridoon ring must not exceed 3.15 inches (8 cm.). Junior Horse Sport Horse Under Saddle classes snaffle bits are mandatory.
  - d. Kimberwicks are prohibited.
  - e. Martingales are prohibited.
  - f. Earplugs are permitted, regardless of type.
- 4. If the show is offering dressage type and hunter type splits, each exhibitor must ensure the appointments (tack and attire) are permitted for the type shown. If the show does not offer splits for the under-saddle classes and/or for championship classes, each exhibitor must ensure their appointments (tack and attire) adhere to one discipline only (dressage or hunter).
  - Whips, bats, and crops are permitted in all Sport Horse Under Saddle classes, including Championships, so long
    as they are appropriate to the type of attire.
  - b. Earplugs are permitted, regardless of type.
- 5. Spurs, whips, bats, crops are permitted in all sport horse under saddle classes, including championships, providing they match the discipline shown according to DR and HU rules.

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#### **AR182 Sport Horse Show Hack**

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- 1. Subchapters AR1 and AR4 apply to Sport Horse Show Hack classes.
- 2. Score sheets are not used for Sport Horse Show Hack. Scribes are not used for Sport Horse Show Hack.
- **3.** Judges must excuse from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger other exhibitors or their entries *or show officials/staff*.
- 4. Sport Horse Show Hack. To enter the ring counterclockwise at a working trot or a working walk. To be shown both directions ways of the ring at the walk, trot, and canter; showing collected, working and extended gaits to be called for, and the hand gallop phases of each gait, plus hand gallop, also both ways of the ring. All phases of all the three gaits to be called for both directions shown both ways of the ring. Horses should stand quietly and rein back readily. Rein back to be requested in the lineup.
  - a. Open to be judged on performance, manners, quality and conformation.
  - b. Amateur to be judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation.
- 5. Fall of horse and/or rider = Elimination
- 6. Horses with an unnatural tail carriage shall will be placed at the bottom of the class.

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#### AR183 Sport Horse Show Hack Appointments (Tack and Attire)

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- 1. Competitors with non-conforming appointments will be eliminated from judging consideration are ineligible to receive an award in that respective class. Appointments (tack & attire) must adhere to one discipline (dressage and hunter) and are not to be mixed. Refer to DR120-121 and HU105-107.
- 2. Protective headgear (as defined in AR111) is encouraged but not required.
- 2. Tack:
- a. Bridles must be:
- 1. Dressage Type: a dressage style snaffle bridle or dressage style double bridle.
- 2. Hunter Type: a hunter style snaffle, Pelham bridle, or hunter style double bridle.
- b. Converters on Pelham bits are not permitted and two reins are required.
- c. Unconventional bits may be penalized at discretion of the judge.
- d. If using a double bridle of either style, the lever arm/shank (length below the mouthpiece) must not exceed 3.94 inches or 10cm. The inside diameter of the bridoon ring must not exceed 3.15 inches or 8cm. Cavesson nosebands to be used but flash nosebands would be acceptable only when using a snaffle bridle and snaffle bit.
- e. Kimberwick bit prohibited.
- f. Martingales are prohibited.
- 318 3. Attire
  - a. Informal attire consists of conservatively colored short, dark coat, with tie, stock tie or choker collar, white or light colored breeches, boots or smooth leather half-chaps, hunt cap, derby, top hat or protective headgear. b. Formal attire consists of white breeches, top hat and shad belly coat may be worn. It is usual to wear such attire after 6:00 p.m. or in championship classes. Protective headgear (as defined in AR111) is encouraged but not required.
  - c. Spurs and whip are optional. If a whip is carried, it may not exceed the length requirements in DR120. Whips, bats, and crops are permitted in all Sport Horse Show Hack classes, including Championships, so long as they are appropriate to the type of attire.
  - d. Earplugs are permitted, regardless of type.
  - 3. Appointments (tack & attire) must adhere to one discipline (dressage or hunter) and are not to be mixed. Refer to DR and HU rules on appointments.
    - a. Double bridles are permitted. If using a double bridle of either type (dressage or hunter), the lever arm/shank (length below the mouthpiece) must not exceed 3.94 inches (10 cm.). The inside diameter of the bridoon ring must not exceed 3.15 inches (8 cm.).
    - b. Unconventional bits may be penalized at the discretion of the judge.
    - c. Kimberwicks are prohibited.
    - d. Martingales are prohibited.
    - e. Earplugs are permitted.
  - 4. Informal or formal attire allowed and must adhere to one discipline. See DR and HU rules.
  - 5. Spurs, whips, bats, crops are permitted in all sport horse show hack classes, including championships, providing they match the discipline shown according to DR and HU rules.

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#### **AR184 Sport Horse Qualifying Description of Gaits**

1. Innate quality movement is a priority in the *all* Sport Horse classes. All gaits should be pure in rhythm and should be without *performed absent of* tension or resistance. *Transitions should be absent of tension and balanced.* 

#### 2. Walk -

- a. Walk. (Also Working Walk) The rhythm of the walk (also working walk) is four beats. The walk is to be regular and unconstrained. There should be a clear "V" to indicate clarity of rhythm.
- b. Collected Walk The-rhythm is four beats **with good tempo**. The stride maintains the marching quality of the working walk with hind legs well engaged but covers less ground.
- c. Extended Walk The rhythm is four beats without rushing. While maintaining the march quality, the horse does not rush, but with regular steps, will clearly show the hind feet touching the ground in front of the footprints of the forefeet. The rider allows the horse to stretch forward with head and neck, but does not release contact with the mouth. Over track and a lengthen of the frame while maintaining the connection demonstrate quality.

#### 3. Trot -

- a. Trot. (Also Working Trot) The rhythm of the trot (also working trot) is two beats. The trot is free, active and regular. The steps should be balanced and elastic with the horse demonstrating a supple back and well engaged hindquarters. The horse should demonstrate balance and elasticity through a supple back and engaged hindquarters.
- b. Collected Trot The rhythm is two beats. The horse continues to move forward with impulsion, and demonstrates an ability to further engage the hocks, which allows the shoulders of the horse to become lighter and the stride to become shorter. good energy and increased engagement. The shift of balance to the hindquarters lightens the forehand, without constraint. The neck is raised and arched, but not constrained.
- c. Extended Trot The rhythm is two beats. The horse covers as much ground as possible while maintaining regularity and balance. The stride lengthens as a result of great impulsion. The rider allows the horse, while remaining on the bit contact, to reach lengthen its frame. The forefeet should touch the ground where they point and there should be over track. The transitions to and from should be balanced and smoothly executed.

#### 4. Canter -

- a. Canter. (Also Working Canter). The rhythm of the working canter is three beats. The canter should be light, cadenced (rhythm with a suitable tempo combined with springy impulsion) and regular. Transitions should be without hesitation and balanced. The canter should always be straight on straight lines properly aligned (not crooked).
- Collected canter The rhythm is three beats. The horse moves forward with impulsion through increased engagement of the hindquarters and lightness of forehand. The neck is raised and arched but not constrained. The back of the horse remains supple, and the strides are shorter cover less ground.
- c. Extended canter The-rhythm is three beats. The horse covers as much ground as possible while maintaining regularity and balance without losing rhythm or balance. The stride lengthens as a result of great impulsion from the hindquarters and the rider allows the horse to lower and extend the neck, without losing contact with the bit, or leaning. The frame of the horse may lengthen and connection is to be maintained without leaning.

#### 5. Lengthening of stride -

When lengthening the stride is requested at the walk, trot or canter (*Sport Horse Under Saddle*), the horse should maintain <del>rhythm,</del> regularity and balance, while <del>reaching with being permitted to lengthen</del> the frame and the stride. The rider should maintain contact with the bit, while allowing the lengthening of the frame. The strides should be more ground covering and the horse should remain calm and supple.

#### 6. Hand Gallop

The rhythm is three beats. The hand gallop is performed with long, free, ground covering powerful strides. The amount of ground covered will vary between horses due to the difference in the natural length of stride. The horse is to remain mannerly, correct and straight correctly aligned (not crooked). Extreme speed to be penalized.

#### 7. Rein-back

The rhythm is two beats. The rein-back is a two-beat diagonal gait. The feet are raised and set down in diagonal pairs. The horse is to remain calm, and obedient, lifting and setting down the feet, compliant and without shuffling. The rider is not to create tension with the reins.

#### AR186 185 Sport Horse Showmanship

- 1. Purpose: To be judged on the presentation of the horse, neatness and appearance of handler, overall condition of the horse, handling techniques, appropriate tack and equipment and ability to show the horse to the best advantage.
- 2. General one entry = one handler, one horse, per class. The same horse may not be used multiple times by different handlers in the same class.
  - a. Classes may be divided by age of handler.
  - b. Unsoundness of the horse being shown shall not penalize a handler unless it is sufficiently severe as to impair the required performance. in which case **P**enalty is at the judge's discretion.
  - c. Offering prize money in Youth Sport Horse Showmanship is prohibited.
  - d. A minimum of six ribbons should be awarded but no more than ten places are recommended.
  - e. Hair must be neat and securely fastened neatly secured so as not to cover the handler's number.
  - f. The handler's number must be worn on the handler's back and must be clearly visible. Number may be attached by string around the waist or attached to the shirt/jacket/vest with magnets or safety pins.
  - g. Excessive coaching or unauthorized assistance in any manner is subject to penalty or disqualification at the judge's discretion.
  - h. If stallions are prohibited, it must be stated in the premium/prize list/omnibus.
- 3. Appointments

Exhibitor's tack and attire must match their specified discipline (*DR or HU*) and are not to be mixed. Refer to Federation/EC, DR, and HU rules. See DR and HU rules. Casual sport horse attire allowed.

The handler may carry one whip, maximum length of 6 feet, including lash and without attachments (i.e. plastic bags, ribbons, etc.)

- a. Tack (see AR179)
- b. Attire: Refer to AR179.2, DR, and HU rules.
- 1. The handler may carry only one whip, maximum length of six feet (6'), including lash and without attachments (i.e. plastic bags, ribbons, etc.)

    - The handler will lead the horse on the perimeter of the triangle at the walk and then the trot, returning to the apex to wait for further instructions *from the judge*. At the completion of judging, the handler will lead the horse away from the judging area. The triangle may be adjusted to fit local conditions.
  - d. Ideally, the horse should be shown in an "open" position. The traditional way of showing **an** open position would be with the right **one** front leg slightly back **forward** and one hind leg slightly forward. The objective is to have all four legs of the horse visible to the judge when standing on either side of the horse; also acceptable all four legs of the horse are visible to the judge when standing on either side of the horse. The horse's head and neck should be allowed to show in horse should be allowed to carry a natural and comfortable carriage, and with the handler standing away slightly away from the horse, with a loose lead line. Handlers may use treats to keep horse's attention and focus. It is permissible for the handler to keep the horse's attention with treats. The whip may be used to guide the horse but not touch the horse with the whip.
  - e. The size of the triangle may be adjusted to fit local conditions.
  - f. Decimals may be used in scoring.
  - g. Tied scores for sport horse showmanship shall be broken first by referring to the Handling Technique and if those scores are equal, refer to the movement scores (walk and trot presentation combined). If still tied, If a tie still exists, the tie will be broken at the judge's discretion.
